Here are some opportunities:

- 1.) Speaker Trainings: We do trainings for those interested in speaking publicly on the topic who feel confident in their interpersonal and presentational skills and who also have an understanding of what human trafficking is and its many faces. The current speaker training this April is full, but we will be having more in the near future.
- 2.) Collections: The Collaborative collects care kit items for Bellefaire JCB Homeless Youth Outreach Program and the Cleveland Rape Crisis Center. Maybe your church could organize a collection of items?
- 3.) SOAP Project: (www.traffickfree.com) Lorain County Collaborative just did a SOAP Project last year. We are hoping to organize a second one this year for both Lorain and Cuyahoga Counties. We will need volunteers for the event and churches, individuals, and groups to sponsor boxes of soap. (A box of soap comes with 1,000 pieces and costs about \$200.)
- 4.) We also have other partner organizations that need volunteers:
